Course Description

Intermediate Class Guitar is a one-semester course that offers the intermediate guitarist instruction in playing techniques, reading guitar notation & tab, crafting melodies, playing chords, and focused study in a specialized technique. Students will review guitar performance basics and blues styles, cover basic rock techniques, and undertake a specialized study in a genre of their choice. Intermediate guitar students will have the opportunity to prepare a program of songs for performance. Students should provide their own instruments.

Unit 1- Basic/Blues Guitar Techniques Review

The Basic/Blues Guitar Review Unit will refamiliarize students with the construction and function of the acoustic instrument, guitar music notation & nomenclature, and fundamental playing techniques including chording and single note melody performance. Daily review topics will be presented through the Garage Band lesson suite including explanation and demonstration of specific skills followed by independent practice. Learning will be assessed through computer assisted play-along drills, and individual coaching session the review. Students will perform for the computer based assessment tool in Garage Band daily, which will measure their mastery of each skill in terms of rhythmic and tonal accuracy. Should students need additional help, practice, or instruction in each topic, they will have access to video lessons and practice drills embedded in the Garage Band software as well as individual coaching session with the course instructor.

Unit 2- Rock Guitar Techniques

The Rock Guitar Unit will introduce students to the tonal palette and stylistic idiosyncrasies of Rock Guitar, Week long topics will be presented through daily lessons including explanation and demonstration of specific skills followed by guided practice and coaching. Learning will be assessed through structured independent practice, computer assisted play-along drills, and individual coaching sessions throughout the topic week. At the conclusion of each topic, students will perform for a computer based assessment tool in Garage Band, which will measure their mastery of each skill in terms of rhythmic and tonal accuracy. Should students need additional help, practice, or instruction in each topic, they will have access to video lessons and practice drills embedded in the Garage Band software.

Unit 3- Players' Choice Guitar Techniques & Recital Preparation

The Player's Choice Unit will provide guitar students the time and structure to study a music genre, technique, or artist of their choosing, and then prepare a brief recital to demonstrate those techniques to the class. Students will find and secure learning materials (texts, recordings, online resources, etc.) with the help and approval of the instructor. Learning will be assessed through structured independent practice, coaching sessions, periodic check-in recordings and practice logs throughout the unit. At the conclusion of the unit, students will perform a recital for the combined guitar class describing and demonstrating their study.
